The 2016 National Specialty

The venue for the annual PWDCA National Specialty show rotates among the East Coast, Midwest, and West Coast, and last year it was the privilege of the PWDCNC to host this weeklong event, which took place mainly in Monterey, September 24-30, 2016. Full coverage of this event will appear in the next issue of the Courier, the official publication of the PWDCA. Results for conformation, obedience, rally, and junior showmanship are available via the MB-F web site. Here we highlight the contributions of the many organizers and volunteers, mainly from the host club, who made this event possible, and we also show attendance figures for the 2016 National and several earlier shows.

Under the skillful guidance and coordination of the co-chairs Barbara Niemann and Cheryl Smith and their steering committee Don Niemann, Susan Cucura, Mike Paterson, Fred Forman, Matthew Davis, and Chuck Teasley, the specialty was an outstandingly successful and enjoyable event. Don Niemann also served as show treasurer. A wide spectrum of club members pitched in to make the show run smoothly.

Barbara Niemann managed a large hospitality organization whose many essential functions included three fantastic social events: a beach welcome party, an awards dinner, and the 25th anniversary dinner. Entry and attendance figures

The tables below indicate the entries for the various events at the recent National compared with those for last year's show in the Midwest and the two most recent earlier West Coast shows, as well as the attendance at three of the evening social events. As is usually the case, the entry at Monterey was somewhat smaller than at shows in the East and Midwest; total entries were about 15% smaller than last year's in Michigan, with most of the difference in conformation-related events. Given that some fluctuations are expected from year to year, total entries as well as those for individual events were similar to those at the earlier West Coast shows. The 4–6 month puppy competition was a premiere in the long series of PWDCA Nationals

A few highlights of the 2016 Regional Specialty

The PWDCNC Regional Specialty was held at Napa Valley Expo in Napa, CA on Friday, November 11, 2016. Matthew Davis ably served as Show Chairperson. He was assisted by Lynn McCallum (Assistant Show Chair and Conformation Chair), Jack McCredie (Obedience & Rally Chair), Ann Gaskell (Assistant Obedience and Rally Chair), and the many other club members whose visible or behind-the-scenes contributions were critical to the success of the specialty.

The show was dedicated to the memory of John Azevedo, a long-time club member who was the chair of the club's first independent specialty in Northern California. A group of John's friends have donated a painting to be awarded for Rally High Combined at the specialty in his memory; it was presented to Don Niemann as its first recipient (see page 7).

The distinguished panel of judges included Virginia Lyne (Regular and Non-Regular Conformation Classes), Rebecca Morin (Puppy and Veteran Sweepstakes, as well as the new 4-6 Month Puppy Competition), and Christopher Cornell (Obedience and Rally). The AKC National Owner-Handled Series competition (NOHS) was also offered at the specialty.

Bacchus Wins 2016 Superdog

The Superdog award is given at each National Specialty to a dog that enters the Superdog competition, and competes in at least three of the six eligible events (agility, conformation, obedience, rally, tracking, and water). Each dog receives points for qualifying and/or placing in each event as determined by the Superdog rules, and the dog with the greatest number of points earns the Superdog title. Highlights of the most recent competition may be found in the November/December 2016 Courier. There were 50 entrants in the competition, a record number. At the end, victory went to Bacchus (BIS MBISS GCHS CH Cortereal Iron Man VCD2 BN RE MX MXB MXS MXJ MJB MXF MFS T2B3 RATN CWDX GROM), handled by PWDCNC member Judy Berger. He was the only entrant to win points in five of the six events. The elegant pottery trophy was made by Elaine Rasmussen in collaboration with Tina Evans.



Update on the Georgie Project

The Georgie Project was begun in 1996 by Dr. Gordon Lark of the University of Utah to collect and study DNA and tissue samples relevant to genetic and other diseases in Portuguese water dogs obtained from autopsy samples. This important project has involved participation by the PWDCA and the owners and breeders of more than 600 PWD's over the past 20 years.

Funding for Phase II of this project, supported by the National Institute of Health, terminated at the end of August, 2016. Dr. Lark is preparing a report on his work, which will be sent to NIH and the PWDCA, and will be published in the Courier.


The work of the Georgie Project will be carried on by Dr. Elaine Ostrander of the National Human Genome Research Institute at the NIH. Dr. Lark will transfer all of the samples to her. According to a letter from Dr. Lark published in the Resources section of the PWDCA web site, he expects the project to be in good hands.





An Appreciation of John Azevedo

It seems only yesterday that Wavies and Curlies, reporting on the 2015 annual meeting, noted that "Geri Azevedo returned this year with her healthy husband, John, to continue her tradition of handing out certificates of new titles earned during the year." But John's recovery was misleading, as he was not able to attend the 2016 meeting, and on April 10 of that year at age 82 he passed away.

John, who earned his master's degree in Biology from San Francisco State University, taught at Patterson High School where he was the Science Department Chair and President of the Patterson Unified Teachers Association. He then taught for 29 years at Modesto

Community College. Always actively supporting his community, at Modesto Community College he chaired their science fairs and served as Treasurer of the Faculty of the Yosemite Community College District.

John loved his Portuguese Water dogs. His kennel, Triangulo A, was awarded the Outstanding Breeder Achievement Award in 2010.

In total John showed four dogs to their championship. His first dog was Naia (Ch Roughrider Naiade de Trian' A CD RAE NAJ), bred by Kathryn Braund and Carol Oakes. His second dog was another Roughrider dog BeGe (Ch Roughrider BeGe de Trian' A CD RAE), also bred by Kathryn. She was John's all-time favorite PWD. BeGe was followed by yet another Roughrider dog, Tify (Ch Roughrider Patife de Trian' A CD RAE3). In 2006 Tify earned scores in the 90's in Rally Advanced B competition. John was very proud of the fourth place ribbon he and Tify earned at the National Specialty in 2000 under Judge Annie Clark. Two of John and Geri's dogs, BeGe and Tify, produced several champions, as well as an outstanding and versatile

performance dog, Libby (MACH5 Triangulo A Liberty Belle VCD3 UDX RAE MXC2 MJG3 MXP MJP MXF TQX). She was owned and trained by judges Barbara and Carl Friedrich. The last dog to get her championship with John was Tassy (Ch Aviator Attache To Triangulo A CD CGCA BN RAE5 THDX TDIAOV). Amy Rutherford handled Tassy for part of her conformation show career. Tassy earned her RAE5, but she relapsed in her training while John was recuperating and not able to work with her. In 2015 he patiently tried to get her to return to his standard. Geri, with support from John, trained Tassy to be certified with Therapy Dogs International. Tassy works at Doctors Medical

Center in Modesto with Geri. She is the first therapy dog to work at that hospital and has acquired quite a following among the staff. In 2015 John showed a pet bitch born in 2013 that he bred. This was Zori (Triangulo A Azoriana), a Tassy pup who continues to be a "work in progress."

For many years, John sold raffle tickets at the club's annual water trial. He wore his hunting hat and vest and did quite a job arm twisting. Few people could turn him down. It was great fun to watch him make the rounds selling the tickets.

John was an active and generous volunteer in the PWDCNC. As such he chaired the first independent regional specialty show in Northern California.

John will be missed by the club members who knew him and enjoyed seeing him handle his dogs, as well as by his wife Geri, two sons Mike and Ken, five grandchildren, and two greatgrandchildren, and no doubt by his youngest and most recent PWD student. 



Denise Gilbert Grooming Seminar

How did you spend your Saturday on February 11? If you were not at a grooming seminar at Happiness Country Kennels with PWDCNC member Denise Gilbert, you missed out on learning some astonishing tricks of the trade when it comes to coping with your PWD's fantastic coat. You must feel a sense of pride when someone marvels at the fourlegged friend you are walking just after a combing and trimming by an excellent groomer. Did you ever stop to think that the groomer's staff probably spent 2 to 4 hours working to get that perfectly coiffed appearance? Are you frustrated because your groomer never seems to get it just right? Do you wonder how a PWD really should be

trimmed? When you enter your friend in conformation competition have you considered not just how the two of you will work as a team in the arena, but how perfectly that coat has been combed prior to entering the arena?

There are a few expert PWD groomers in the area. There is a reason that some of our members are driving 100 miles to get to

one of them to groom their dog. But in Portola Valley there is a unique groomer named Denise Gilbert. She is unique because her main interest goes beyond grooming the dog. She is especially interested in helping the owners to care for their dog and for them to know how to evaluate a groomer. She is happy to help owners learn how to groom their own pets. Denise is primarily interested in doing retriever or lion cuts for pets or event performance dogs, rather than for the conformation show ring. Be prepared to invest in

take on the challenge of grooming and clipping your dog yourself; Denise estimates that it will take about a year to recover your initial investment. Previous seminar attendees who were already clipping their dogs still picked up valuable tips. Who knew that the various brands of clippers are of different weights and that the lighter weight could may make a big difference in handling clippers? Attendees who only wanted to brush out mats before going to an expert PWD groomer learned how many slickers, combs and detangling sprays there are and which ones will make the task easier. It was amazing to see Denise transform a dog brought to

some equipment if you are going to

class that looked like it might be a Schnauzer mix, because of its long ears, to one with a stylish PWD head, just by clipping the hair at the end of the ears close to the ear leather.

A couple of other tips Denise shared: never put conditioner on your dog's head or blow dry the head with a high velocity dryer because the hair on the head should have as much wave or curl

as possible. Also, beware of a groomer cutting the PWD's legs too short so that the legs are out of proportion with the rest of the body.

If you are wise you will not miss the next time Denise offers a seminar. Also, you can book a grooming session next time your pet needs to be clipped and plan to watch Denise work. She is always happy to help PWD owners meet the challenge of keeping their dog looking its finest.
